OUR INITIATIVES: BLACK IN IMMUNO WEEK 2021

We hosted our second Black In Immuno Week to amplify, connect, and support Black immunologists the week of November 14–20, 2021. The week contained live-streamed panels and scientific talks, networking events, wellness events, and multiple social media campaigns to showcase the breadth of scientific achievement, advocacy, and journeys of Black immunologists across the world.

Last year, our theme of "From Bench to Bedside" not only highlighted scientists' basic and translational immunology work, but also centered on the biomedical community's relationship with patients and the wider public.

Our event, like our organization, saw global engagement with registrants and social media participants from five of the seven continents: North America, Europe, Africa, South America, and Asia. Over 400 individuals participated in our livestreamed programming, and our recordings of the events now have over 600 views.

Hosting Black In Immuno Week on a new platform, Hopin, also enabled registrants to make direct connections with one another and will facilitate even more networking in our future events. Over 400 participants

In 2021, we hosted a series of virtual chats to facilitate connection within the community. Participants were able to introduce themselves, their interests, their science and their challenges.

• Black In Immuno x AAI (May 8 2022): We co-sponsored the "Neonatal Immunity and Neuroimmunology" session with the Minority Affairs Committee at the annual meeting for the American Association for Immunologists. The session, was chaired by Dr. Michael Opata and Dr. Dionna Williams and included talks by the chairs, Olivia Solomon, Shevon N. Alexander, and E. Evonne Jean. This gave young black trainees and faculty an opportunity to showcase their research. The session was well attended and one of the highlights for the MAC sponsored events at AAI. We were thrilled to see so many Black immunologists and Black in Immuno supporters at the conference!



• Changemaker Series (April 14 2022): We have started a new discussion series to spotlight individuals driving change and to stimulate collective learning about advocacy and activism in STEM. Our inaugural event in April featured Dr. Juliet Daniel, Professor and cancer biologist in the Department of Biology, McCaster University. Dr Daniel spoke about her career journey as a Black scientist and her research on breast cancer in Black women. We have more speakers lined up for 2023 and are excited to continue the conversations.
